Young Champions Student Heart Screening





Community based heart screenings for Clark County and Portland Metro area students, sponsored by the Quinn Driscoll Foundation and Peace Health Southwest Heart and Vascular.

The Quinn Driscoll Foundation is named for 13-year-old Quinn Driscoll, a student athlete at Wy' East Middle School who died in 2009 after suffering sudden cardiac arrest while running on the track during gym class.

Quinn had undiagnosed hypertrophic cardiomyopathy (HCM), a serious heart condition that is one the leading causes of sudden cardiac death in young athletes.

Sudden cardiac arrest occurs every 3 days in a public school, occurring often without symptoms. Have your child screened today!

Who is eligible?

- All students within Clark County and surrounding Portland Metro area who are between 12–18 years of age
- This screening does not take the place of the pre-performance examination requirement for all student athletes who wish to participate in a school sport

What is included in the screening?

- Review of child's personal and family health history
- Blood pressure, height and weight measurement
- ECG/EKG (electrocardiogram)
- Echocardiogram/cardiologist consult if necessary
